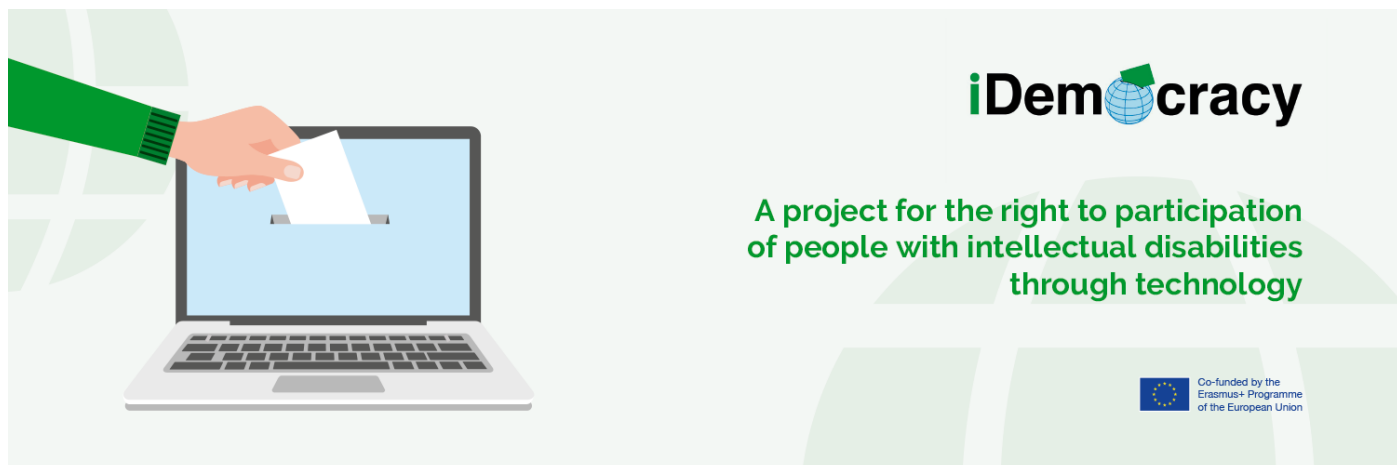


IDemocracy voting tool. Supporter's Manual

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Short description

The IDemocracy Voting Tool is a digital educational tool. It lets Supporters create digital voting campaigns for users with intellectual disabilities (PwID) and it lets PwID users participate in digital campaigns. PwID users can also generate and overview voting their own campaigns.

The voting tool is accessible at: <https://etools.idemocracy.webs.upv.es/> It is a responsive web application. Thus, it works correctly in computers, tablets and smartphones.

Home screen

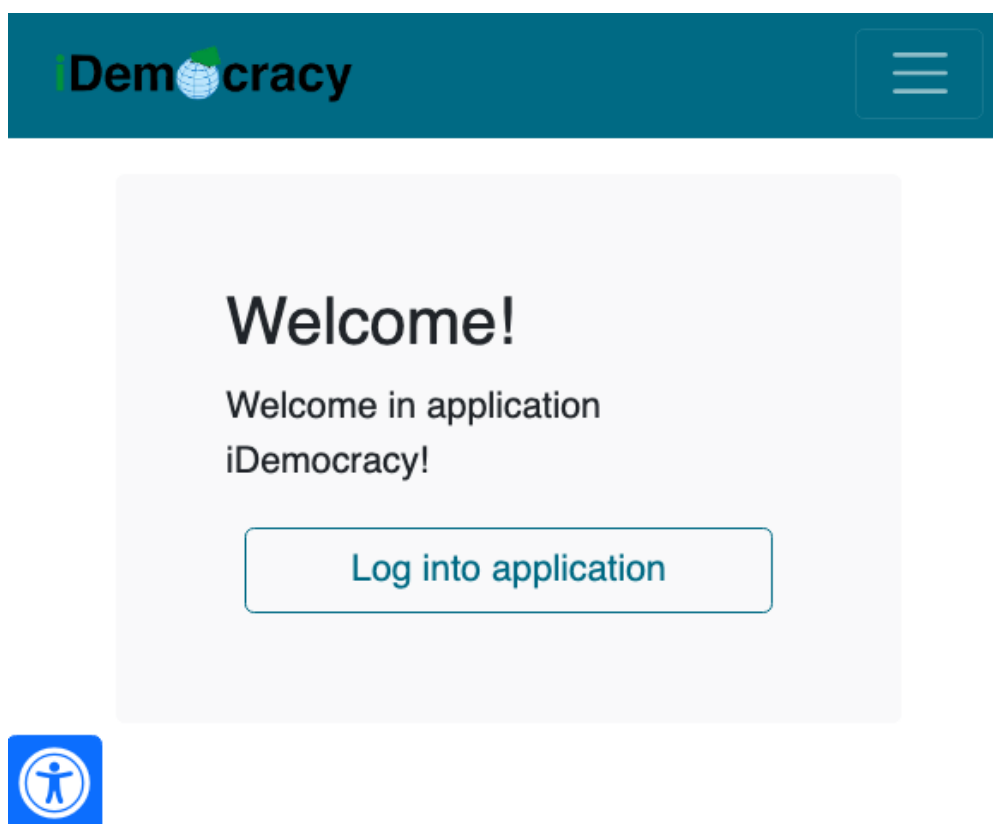



Figure 1. Home screen.

The IDemocracy home screen lets the supporter log into the application. As can be seen in Figure 1, there is an **accessibility button** (options: Increase / Decrease font size; Grayscale; Negative; Reset settings). The accessibility button will be **available across the whole web app**.

The login button is available for two kinds of users: Supporters and Admins. In this case, we are following the Supporter use case.

Log in screen

User should introduce their username and their password.

In case the password was forgotten, it can be recovered through the “Forgotten password?” link (e-mail must be introduced, and a link will be sent to the user).

Once we login, the Profile-Dashboard screen will be shown in the supporter’s own language.

Profile-Dashboard screen

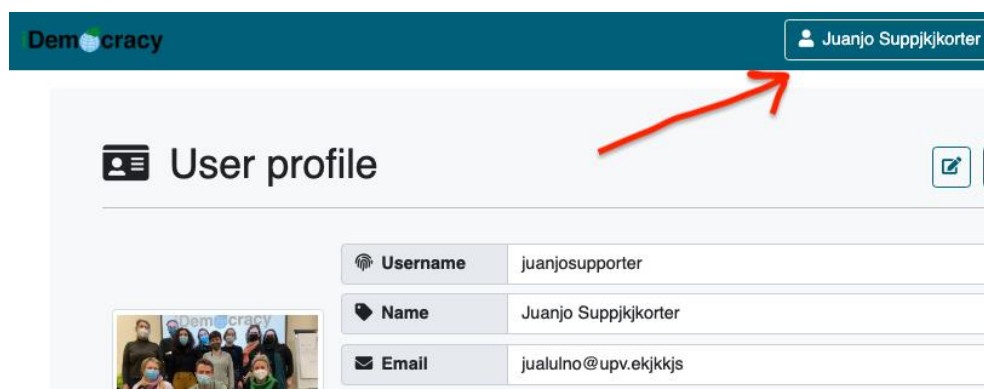


Figure 4. "Home" screen button. It directs the Supporter to his/her profile screen.

IMPORTANT: At the top bar in all screens, once the Supporter has logged in, there is a button with the Supporter name. At any moment, the Supporter user can click on that button and go back to the Profile screen.

If the paper and pencil button is clicked, the user is able to change their language, though this is not necessary (the admin will create the supporter accounts in each person's language).

Let's take a more comprehensive look at the Profile screen:

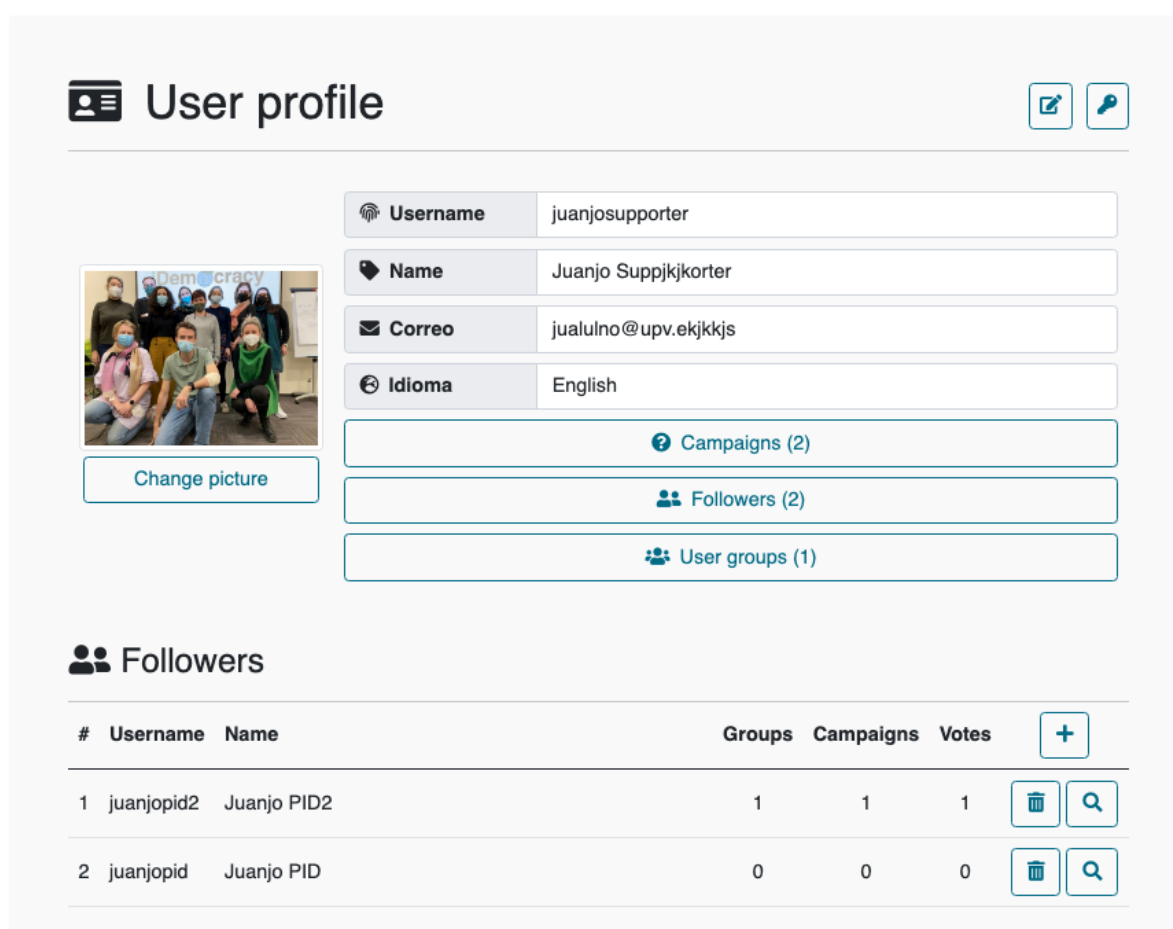



Figure 5. Profile-Dashboard complete screen

As can be seen, we can:

- Change our picture through the *Change picture* button
- Access the Campaigns screen through the *Campaigns* button (the number in parenthesis indicates how many campaigns we have created).

- Access the follower section (list of PwID users that depend on me as a supporter). This section is already visible in Figure 5, with a sample list with two PwID users.
 - o The follower section has information about:
 - Username
 - Name
 - Groups that the user is a member of
 - Campaigns created by the user
 - Votes emitted by the user.
- Access the User groups section.

This is a screen where we can see the information about the user and help the user as supporters.

We have the general user information. We can change the picture if necessary (the picture may be changed by the PwID user and is recommended that the PwID user changes it by themselves).

The **Campaigns button** shows the user campaigns (in **¡Error! No se encuentra el origen de la referencia.**, the user has 1 campaign, and it is visible in the bottom of the screen).

Voted campaigns lists the campaigns the user has participated in.

The **Votes button** brings us to the votes the PwID user has emitted, and the specific choice for the vote.

The **User groups section** shows the different groups the user is a member of. If we click on "View group", a list with all the PwID users who are members of this group will be shown.

View QR invitation button: It shows the QR so the Supporter can show it to the PwID user and then the PwID will directly log in through the link the QR has embedded (this can be handy in case the PwID user does not have the access link at that moment).

Adding users

The initial step is adding PwID users to the platform.

Clicking on the “+” button in the Followers section (in the Profile screen), a new PwID user can be created.

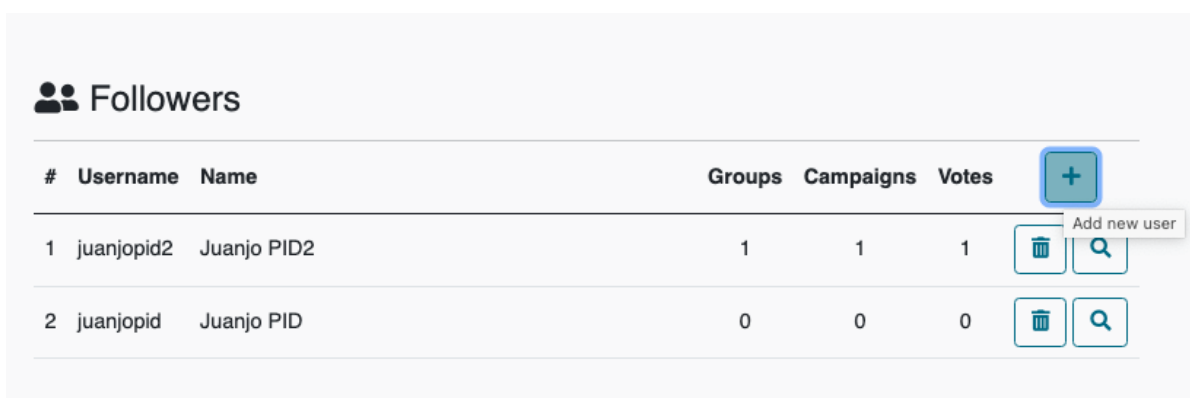


Figure 7. 'Followers' section (PID users section): sample users

A pop-up window will be displayed where we must introduce a username, a Full Name and the e-mail:

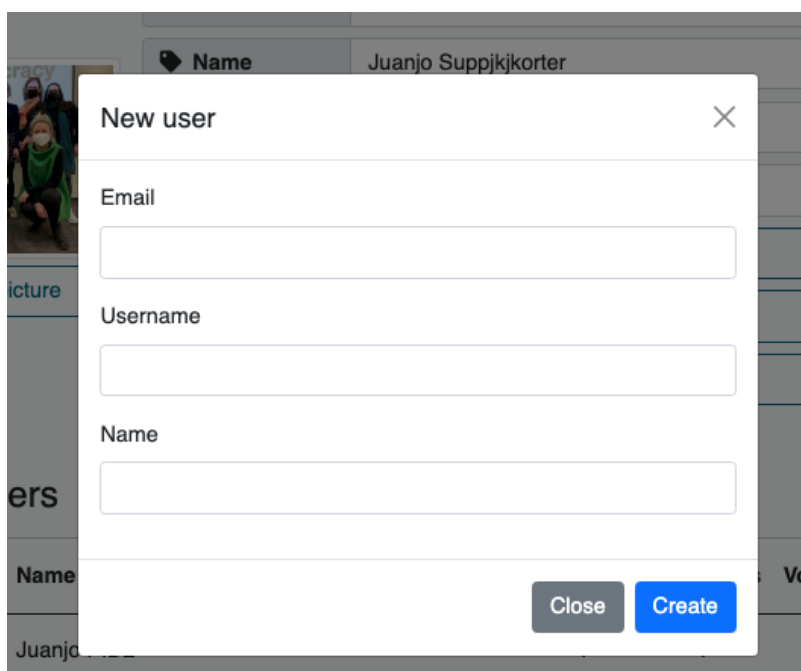


Figure 8. New user (pop-up) screen

The PwID user will receive a login link through email, so they do not need to remember a password. At the same time, the access to the platform is protected by the link that only the email owner has.

Once we click on Create, the PwID user account will be created and an email will be sent to the user, so they can log in, create their own campaigns, change their picture, etc.

Adding a new campaign

The supporter may create a campaign through the “+” button in the campaign list.





Figure 10. New campaign. Initial screen

A step-by-step guide will be shown asking for the Campaign information.
Specifically:

1. Campaign name
2. Question that will be asked to the voters


When you click on Create, there will appear the new campaign and you will need to introduce the data.





Each choice can be accompanied by an image that you can upload from your device. This can be helpful to facilitate the comprehension of the choices.

In the Voters section, you can add users or groups of users for the campaign, as explained in the website.



Voters

Here you can set voters for this campaign. User groups or specific users can be added through  buttons below. User who is overlapped with group will be emailed only once. User, who is owner of this campaign, can be added as voter too.

When you add user or group, this campaign will be locked against editing for the user who owns this campaign (Is not applied for supporters).

Once choices, users, etc. have been added, the campaign needs to be sent to the users. A button will be visible to send the campaign to all users.

When the user clicks, they will be shown the voting choices. Once they vote, the result will appear in the Campaign details and the user status will appear as “voted” with their choice (once the first user votes, the campaign cannot be edited anymore).

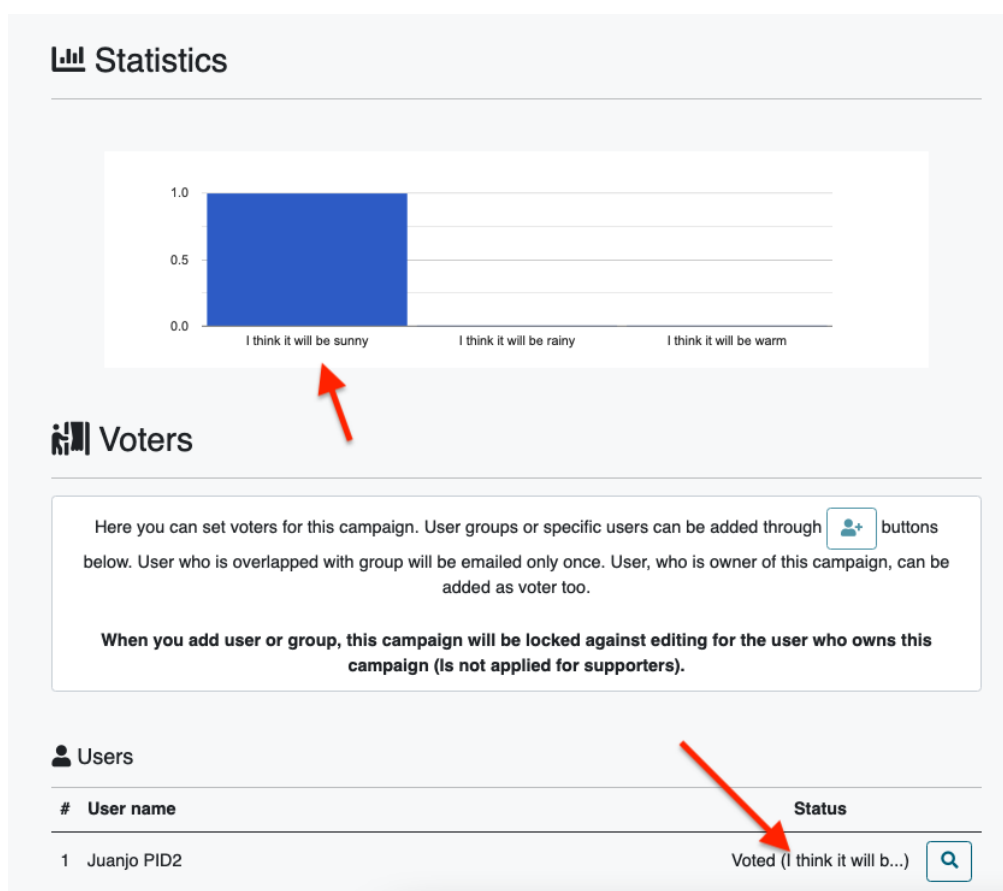


Figure 17. Campaign data with voting process information.
